

Effective Practices and Predictors: Why are they important?

It's the law -

 IDEA (2004), WIOA (2014), and ESSA (2015), each reference use of scientific and/or research-based, and/or evidence-based and promising practices

Students don't have time to waste -

• IEP teams should be designing transition services that are more likely to help students achieve their post-school goals

Program Improvement -

- Evaluating existing programs
- Developing and expanding programs that are most effective
- Revising and eliminating programs that are least effective

Academic Skills

- Focus on College and Career Readiness Skills and Experiences
 - Academic and non-academic
- → Find and Provide Resources to Teachers for:
 - Skills and Experiences to be College and Career Ready
- Embedding "Transition" into Academic Content
- Supporting Inclusion in HS
 - Co-Teaching, Collaboration, Work-based learning
- Focus on School Completion and School Engagement for At Risk Students
- Use Evidence-based Academic Interventions to Teach






Life, Social & Emotional Skills

- Adult Roles and Responsibilities
- Self-determination (e.g., goal setting, decision making, problem solving, self-advocacy, etc.)
- → Independent living skills (e.g., financial, first aid, safety, cooking, etc.)
- → Interpersonal skills
- → Leisure skills
- → Transportation skills
- → Classroom behavior
- → Social skills
- Youth autonomy fostered and supported







Career Development & Employment

- Develop Work-based Internships
- Collaborate with Career Technical Education
- Collaborate with Workforce Centers
- Join Community Business Organizations
- → Utilize Student Connections
- Establish a System for Organizing Business
 Contacts
- Maintain High Expectations for Integrated Employment
- Learn about Customized Employment







Interagency Collaboration

- → Attend Resource Fairs
- Collaborate with Area Transition Coordinators
- Establish Relationships with Community Organizations
- Organize Trainings Sharing Information about Community Agencies
- Establish a Community Transition Team
- → Develop Resource Directory for Families & NTAC Students
